Each student received a CBCA bookmark as a memento.







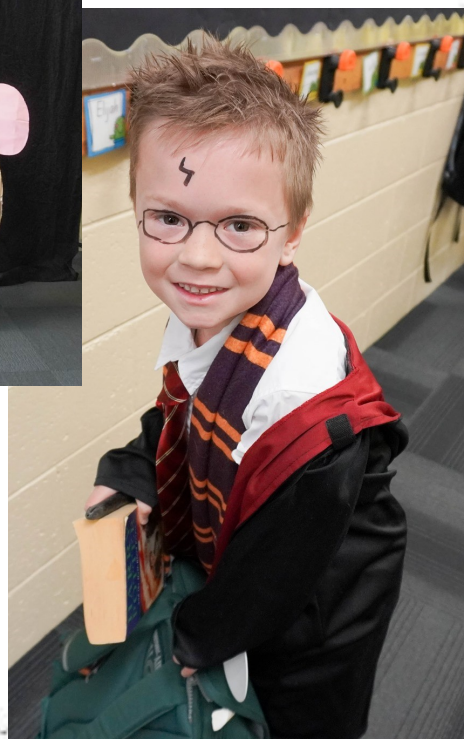
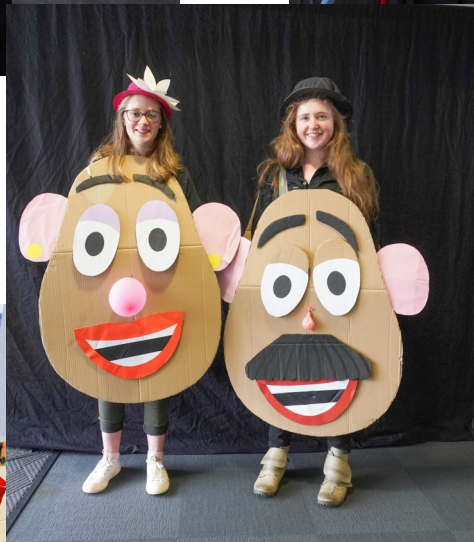

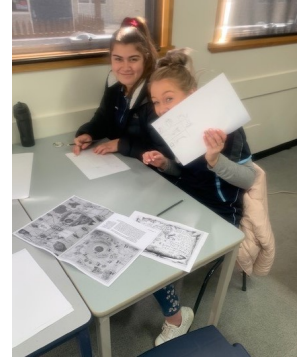

Sarah Wing (Certificate II in Community Services Focus on Children's Services)

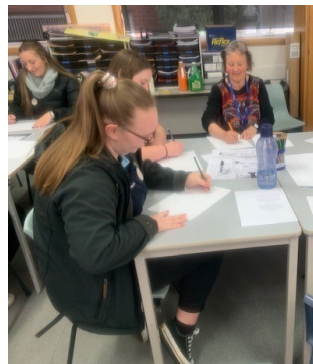
*I learnt about elements of a book. For example, bright colours, easy reading for a young child. Julie Hunt & Dale Newman also helped me use these elements efficiently.*
