#### **Book Week Event at Government House**

Over 70 members and friends of CBCA Tasmania and *Read Aloud to Your Child Every Day* supporters gathered at Government House on Friday, July 16. We were warmly welcomed by Government House staff and Her Excellency, the Honourable Barbara Baker AC and Emeritus Professor Don Chalmers. Tony Flowers, short-listed illustrator, spoke about the illustration process, sharing original artworks from his current book in progress. Calvin Christian School students, supported by Marc Mumford, shared insights from their experience as Shadow Judges of the Picture Book of the Year category. Many shared reflections on Timeless, which was the 2024 Winner, though not the Shadow Judges choice!







#### **Book Week Celebrations: Hutchins School**

#### **Book-in-a-Bag**

This year, The Hutchins School launched a new initiative for Book Week, Book-in-a-Bag, which replaced the traditional Book Week Dress Up Day. The intended purpose was to re-orient the Book Week focus on books and support our continuing efforts towards building a positive culture of reading across the school. Students were invited to celebrate a favourite book by decorating a paper bag and filling it with items that represent that story. Teachers were provided with lesson plans and guidelines to begin this project at school, whilst parents were provided with clear instructions for students to select items from home and/or make items to include in the bag. During Book Week, students shared their Book-in-a-Bag with their classmates and buddies. We have been inundated with positive feedback and in a recent survey, 58% of families said that they would like Book-in-a-Bag or something similar to replace the Book Week Dress Up Day moving forwards and 24% saying they would like to alternate the Dress Up Day with a Book-in-a-Bag style experience. With the 2025 theme of Book an Adventure, maybe Book-in-a-Suitcase will be our focus?! (Editor: Or Book-in-a-Backpack...)

## **Primary Readers' Cup South**

For those not familiar with Readers' Cup, students read the assigned texts, and then compete in a quiz about the texts and present a prepared creative challenge on one of the texts they have read. We are still locking in details as to whether, given the time allocated, to use 4 or 6 texts. Prizes are allocated to the winning team of the quiz, the winning team of the creative challenge and the overall Readers' Cup winner.




#### **ASLA Mini-conference**




